>
> *My email on Tuesday might have been lost in the noise for many of you,
> so I apologize and am resending. To recap, the HEAD code freeze was
> extended by three days to allow for some final pending work to be
> committed and prepare 5.1 to be a good release. The code freeze will
> likely end sometime tomorrow, May 30, after which HEAD will open back
> up. We ask that large scale changes still be deferred until after
> 5.1 is actually released so that any problems can be dealt with. The
> release engineering team will send out emails explicitly stating when
> HEAD has thawed and when large changes like new compilers and
> dynamic-linked worlds can go it.
> Also as a reminder, ***if you have patches that have been approved for
> commit, but you have not committed them yet, please do so as soon as
> possible***. We want to make a very positive splash with 5.1 since*

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> *it is being released right before USENIX ATC and will have working
> KSE and 1:1 threads. We appreciate all of the hard work and patience
> that everyone has given!*
