In the last episode (Jul 29), Ruslan Ermilov said:

- > *Hm, I always thought that -O2 and -Os are just useful aliases that in*
- > *effect only turn a few dozens of -f optimization flags, and that*
- > *switching some of them off later is allowed. I.e., "-Os*
- > *-fno-strict-aliasing" should work.*

That does work, but there are still things you can't turn off with -f.

They're half-aliases. `toptev.c::parse_options_and_default_flags` does set -f flags based on the optimization level, but there is still a whole lot of gcc code that directly tests the value of `optimize` and `optimize_size`.
