> *edit /etc/fstab and make this entry: -*

> */dev/da1 /mnt msdos noauto,user,umask=0 0 0*
>
> *that didn't work. I got some error about Inappropriate file type or*
> *format. Changed filetype to vfat and that didn't work either like it*
> *does in Linux.*

/dev/da1 is not what you want. That's the device, but it doesn't specify the slice. The umass driver treats the memory stick like a SCSI harddrive, so your mount command should also treat it like a harddrive. You should be using "da1s1" or similar instead. (In UNIX terminology, a "slice" is roughly equivalent to a DOS primary partition.)
