There are a few options in the ports tree and I'm wondering if anyone has played with them and has an opinion. I've seen ccscript and cint, I also know root has a C interpreter (though I don't know how good it is, and it's for scientific numerical analysis, not generic programming).

as a secondary (probably stupid) question: how hard is it to write a library in C++ and allow C programs to use it?
