> *ifconfig rl0 ether 11:22:33:44:55:66*

> *So I guessed I could make life a little easier by*
> *adding this in my /etc/rc.conf file as:*

> *ifconfig_rl0="inet 192.168.123.2 netmask 255.255.255.0*
> *ether 11:22:33:44:55:66"*
>
> *However, this does not seem to work. No IP address*
> *is assigned to the LAN card after bootup.*
> *Apparently something is wrong here.*
> *Any idea how I can do this at bootup?*

echo 'ifconfig rl0 ether 11:22:33:44:55:66' >/etc/start_if.rl0
```
