Hello manager,

I am not sure if this is beyond the scope of this listserv but I will ask anyway.

Due to a hardware failure I needed to rebuild my DS20 webserver (which is a webserver for access to a library catalogue on a separate server) onto an ES40. I re-installed the O/S TRU64 V5.1A (patched up to date....it was previously unpatches) and then restored the backup tape.

This would have restored apache version 1.3.9 and all the configurations set by our third party vendor.

My problem is that through Netscape, Opera, and other browsers (not IE) the redirection of http-equiv does not work. The text is displayed rather than the page.
